2.	COVID-19	 Suzanna and James updated on their current operational situation related to the COVID-19 situation. A discussion took place around asking Coalition members what the impact is on their individual agencies at next week's Council meeting i.e. what are the issues, what can the Coalition/Advocacy Group do to help. This discussion would take the place of the Hot Topic. It was suggested the Council meeting take place virtually and videoconferencing platforms were discussed. <u>Brainstormed</u>: creation of a One Pager with an update from all organizations what their operational status is Collect a list of social media groups - publish list for service providers to share with their clientele. Members send us what they see on Facebook and share on our website. (Needs to be vetted by Advocacy first.) Organizations have food pantries - maximize pantry shelves. How can we support them to stay open - can we mobilize as a Coalition, put together packages to make deliveries? 	

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		 Coalition could offer an Urgent Needs Fund for its members. United Way Simcoe Muskoka has an urgent Needs fund - likely will see an increase in requests. Mental health walk-in clinics are closed. Is there a phone number for people to call re anxiety? Shared service opportunities - if offices are closed can we use people in other ways? What resources can member agencies provide during down time to help especially re gaps in system. Cross pollination of agencies. Mobile some Coalition resources to help Health Unit eg. drive-in assessment centres; remove some of the burden off hospitals.
