From this, we moved towards aligning presentations to Council with our Strategic Directions. An earnest congratulations to Carolyn Shoreman as the recipient of the Coalition's Award of Excellence in November 2018 in recognition of her work assisting the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit in achieving Baby Friendly Initiative designation.

The Integrated Planning Table's (IPT) has been developing and piloting a Warm Transfer Guideline. Their work this past year also included the creation of three subgroups working on Transitional Aged Youth, Cultural Competencies and an Evaluation Framework, as identified in the IPT's workplan.

Other Coalition initiatives included the Executive Committee's design and future implementation of a dashboard to be housed on the Coalition website; the new refreshed Coalition logo, which was approved by members in March 2019; and the creation of a new Advocacy Group and their work taking a Pulse Poll at each Council Meeting which will lead to the development of position papers on issues that are important to our membership.

Please join me in welcoming the new Chair, Melanie McLearon. I encourage you to continue to exchange ideas, learn and share with each other as we move forward supporting our

community.

Annual Coalition Award and Recognition Program

The Coalition's recognition program which celebrates the work of the Coalition and its members by highlighting successful projects and outstanding collaboration, was changed to one award. The Award of Excellence is awarded annually to either an individual involved with the Coalition who, through a substantial commitment to collaboration, has made a significant impact regionally contributed to the outcomes identified in the Coalition's strategic plan, or one project that demonstrates significant alignment with the Coalition's goals and priorities and involves collaboration between at least two member organizations.

Carolyn Shoreman, Director, Community and Family Health Dept., Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit was the recipient of the 2018 Award of Excellence in recognition of her work leading to the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit achieving its Baby Friendly Initiative designation in December 2017. This initiative has had great impact for families in our community and will have lasting results for all.

Carolyn was presented with the award at the November Council meeting. Carolyn was also recognized for her long history and commitment to the Coalition through her participation and leadership on numerous tables and as a past chair. Dr. Charles Gardner, Medical Officer of Health and CEO of SMDHU, who nominated Carolyn for this award, also spoke of Carolyn's focused leadership and strong vision.

Staff Development/Leadership Training

The YMCA of Simcoe/Muskoka and Lakehead University partnered Not-for-Profit Leadership Certificate Program continues to gain ground as more regional nonprofits take part. As a result, and due in part to being the Coalition's professional development program of choice, year three of the YMCA/Lakehead Nonprofit leadership program was yet again a resounding success! Since the program's launch four years 202 individuals from 76 different organizations have successfully completed Level One, and 68 current and future leaders within the nonprofit sector have achieved full certification. This includes 58 employees from 15 different Coalition member organizations that have taken part in the program since its inception.

Something NEW! An alumnus-led continuing education and professional development for the alumni and participants in the Not-for-Profit Leadership Program is in progress. Wednesday, November 6, 2019 will be the first of future full day interactive workshops for this network of regional leaders.

Report Card 2019

The 2018-21 Coalition's strategic plan identified four directions that support children, youth and families thriving in a strong, nurturing community; the updates below illustrate how some of the working groups contributed towards these directions:

Child and Youth Crisis Steering Committee:

- Regular contributor to the development of pathways developed in partnership with the LHIN and Moving on Mental Health, resulting in the elimination of the Suicide Risk Protocol
 - brought clarity and lessened confusion about the process
- Pathways training to over 200 professionals in North Simcoe
- Helped develop a resource card for children, youth, parents and professionals. Five Thousand English and 2000 French were printed and disseminated

COMPASS Co-Management:

- Reviewed the role of various mental health service providers going into schools to ensure clarity, reduce duplication and understand the services offered to Tier 2,3 and 4 children and youth
- Reviewed specific questions from chairs of local COMPASS tables and ensured we are supporting them
- Sharing of resources and updates on training that various agencies are undertaking to keep the table informed

Triple P:

- 71 single session Primary Care in person or via telephone
- 55 seminars
- 24 single Parenting Topic group sessions
- Group Triple P Series –over 25 sessions offered. Sessions regularly offered throughout Simcoe County.
- 20 free Online Triple P Codes provided
- Teen Groups are consistently offered throughout the county.
- Parents calling Health Connection (SMDHU) can receive 1:1 counseling and support over the phone
- · Limited seminars and tip sheet sessions offered

Autism Spectrum Disorders Partnerships:

Thirty-seven people attended a networking/intake day in November 2019 with 34 out of 37 indicating that the day was very beneficial. Data was collected on future discussion topics and areas of interest with the next day to be held in October 2019

Best Start:

- Increased number in shared resources
- Increased number of integrated services and partnerships
- Improvements in navigating system
- Improvements of supports for families
- Reduction in duplication of services

Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Disorders (FASD):

- Development of a pilot FASD Diagnostic Clinic for grades four to eight three children have already received a neuro-psychological assessment
- Received Parent/Caregiver Support Group Funding, which allowed the updating of brochures in French and English and the provision of two parent trainings – "Executive Functioning" and "Self-Regulation". Approximately 20 parents attended these trainings as well as 6 members from SCDSB
- Development of a FASD Conference on September 10-11, 2019 able to offer this conference to 100 people
- Helping York Region develop their FASD Plan
- Continued training regarding FASD by Leads Committee to their respective agencies
- Several municipalities issuing proclamations of September 9th, 2019 as FASD Awareness
 Day
- Prevention group reviewed and revised the FASD Curriculum for high schools

Poverty Reduction Task Group (PRTG):

- Living Wage presentation scheduled the end of September to the City of Barrie with Living Wage Week set for early November
- PRTG and SCATEH Coordinated Social Determinants of Health event (under discussion and planning)
- Developing working tables as needed to accomplish work plan priorities
- Support Coalition's efforts around the Federal Election
- Lots of learning opportunities through presentations: oral health, youth job program, other
 poverty tables, different structures of poverty reduction groups across the province,
 sustainability plans, etc.
- Continue to attend Tamarack + Cities Reducing Poverty monthly updates and webinars that are shared to the broader group
- Update the Work Plan to align with the Coalition's new strategic direction



Highlights of 2018-2019

- √ The 2018-2021 Coalition Strategic Plan was approved at the September 2018 Council meeting.
- √ A 2018-2021 Strategic Workplan, which includes actions for Council, Executive Committee and the Integrated Planning Table (IPT), has been developed.
- Carolyn Shoreman was the recipient of the Coalition's 2018 Award of Excellence.
- ✓ The Coalition's brand has undergone some change and refinement this year. With the assistance of a graphic design student from Georgian College, a refreshed logo was introduced in March 2019. Work on the Coalition website took place over the summer and the new site was presented in September with a new fresh, modern look (www.simcoecountycoalition.ca). Additional work on branding our communication tools (letters, reports, presentations, etc.) will take place in the fall, again with the assistance of a Georgian College graphic design student.
- √ The Cultural Competency sub-committee is working on developing a self-awareness tool for agencies.
- ✓ Work is underway in creating an evaluation framework
- A One Page Meeting Summary was developed for Council and Integrated Planning Table meetings to provide members with a quick overview of the highlights of meetings.
- ✓ The newly formed Advocacy Group has begun taking an electronic pulse poll at Council meetings and has put out its first position paper: A Living Wage in Simcoe County. Work on a Federal Election Strategy is also underway.
- ✓ Planning is underway for a half day event ,Successful Transitions: Navigating to Adult Systems, hosted by the Coalition for service providers and taking place October 3, 2019.
