3.	Award of Excellence / Coalition Claps	Award of Excellence Christine reviewed the criteria for the Award of Excellence. Two excellent nominations were received. Lesley's dedication in advancing the priorities and goals of the Coalition through her dedication in advocating for people impacted by poverty and raising awareness of the importance of infant and early childhood intervention and prevention was highlighted. Members congratulated Lesley and shared their experiences working with Lesley. Lesley thanked the Coalition and colleagues for their kind words in honouring her with this award. Hot Topic: No Money for Food is Cent\$less	Christine welcomed presenters Christine Bushey and Vanessa Hurley from SMDHU who provided a presentation on behalf of the Poverty Reduction Task Group on No Money for Food is Cent\$less.  Christine thanked the presenters and the floor was opened for questions. Continued advocacy and opportunities to reduce food insecurity is still needed. The efforts from the Advocacy Group in creating a position paper on Basic Income and a Living Wage was noted. 6.	Calls for Communications Officer / Anti- Oppression Framework Ad Hoc Committee	Communications Officer  Melanie Slade Morrison will be stepping down from the role of Communications Officer for the Coalition due to work priorities. Melanie was thanked for the support she has provided over the past six years. Christine provided an overview of the position and a callout to replace Melanie was issued. 		Anti-Oppression Framework Ad Hoc Committee  Further to the discussion that took place at Council on racial disparity, the  Executive Committee approved the creation of an ad hoc committee to work on an anti-oppression framework. This committee will be led by Christine with the goal for the completion of this work by March 21st, Anti-Oppression Day. 7.	Coalition Investment Fund	James Thomson, Trustee for the Coalition, provided a report with regards to the surplus funds in the Coalition's account that are a result of unspent membership fees and funds from underspending year to year. Discussion took place at Executive with regards to how best to utilize these funds to ensure long term sustainability of the Coalition as well as being able to access funds to allocate for strategic initiatives. The Executive Committee agreed to investigate putting \$145,000 into an investment fund that was a mix of short and long term investments that would generate revenue and maintain and strengthen the Coalition's reserve. As some of these funds are a result of membership fees, approval of a motion to invest these funds would be needed from members.  Members were asked for their input regarding the investment plan. Discussion included it seemed like a large amount of money to move, have all options been considered, adjusting membership fees for the upcoming membership year i.e. subsidizing membership fees for organizations facing financial hardship or	
		reducing fees for member agencies especially during these challenging times.  James advised these issues have been discussed by Executive. The current bank balance is \$223,000. \$145,000 was the amount considered to be a safe amount to invest based on the end of March 2020, in terms of not impacting operations for the remainder of this fiscal year. If \$145,000 is moved over it would go into short and long term investment so funds can be accessed if needed for strategic initiatives or possibly subsidies. Putting some money in longer term investments would help to build reserves and support sustainability of membership. Looking for conversations from the membership's standpoint what are the pressures/challenges and how we can use funds more proactively.  James will bring the discussion today back to the Executive Committee to include consideration of other pressure points i.e. subsidies, returning a portion	Send in any additional feedback to James or Julie. 9.	Ontario Health Teams	Valerie Grdisa provided an update on the Ontario Health Teams (OHT) in our region and provided an overview of the evolution to this system.  The Barrie OHT is in development, South Georgian Bay and Couchiching have been approved and are underway and their population is fragile seniors. Through Waypoint's leadership and all the mental health and addiction agencies, there is an OHT for specialized populations focused on children and youth, seniors and indigenous populations. The discussions that are happening are around understanding the social determinants of health and how important it is to have broader inter-sectoral planning discussions. 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Item	County of Simcoe - Lora provided an update on the 2020 enumeration which took place Nov. 17-23 with point in time on November 17 <sup>th</sup> and also commented on the support received from outreach, housing providers. It was different this year with people in place due to the motel model. Will bring back the summary on the data. Continuing to work on lessons learned during COVID, the survey asked if people are homeless as a result of COVID pressures.  North Simcoe Youth Hub - Rhonda advised the funding for the three year pilot with Waypoint as lead and multiple partners ends March 2021 but will be getting ongoing base funding to continue with components as a permanent services. 	<b>SMCDSB</b> - Chantelle reported that as a result of recent Ministry funding, mental health staff for elementary and secondary schools have been hired, as well as the creation of an educator mental health website (a centralized place for easy access of resources). There is space for links to community agencies - could look at how to use that for referrals. Trying to figure out who are not seeking/being referred for help (virtual students).	
	<b>United Way</b> - Trillium has a call for funding for their Resilient Communities Fund - deadline is Dec. 9 <sup>th</sup> . UWSM have just allocated another \$520,000 to 21 projects across Simcoe Muskoka to support vulnerable populations via the Federal Emergency Community Support Fund - to be spent by Mar 31.	
	<b>Community Connection</b> continues to offer Urgent Needs Fund in collaboration with 211 handling intake and assessment to connect people with resources and then consideration for UNF - funds are distributed via 6 regional agency leads.	Reminder to update your records with 211.
